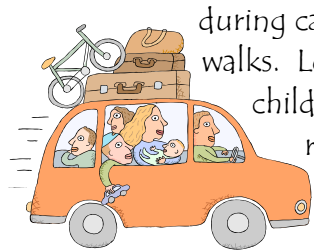


As Parents You Can Help Your Child Succeed By...

Even though a child may not be as identified as needing help from the Title I program teachers also benefit from the Title I

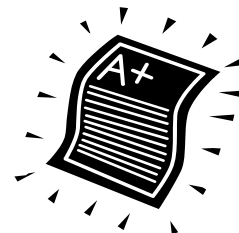
- In service Programs

- Allows students one on one instruction on the computer aided Accelerated Reader Program. This program allows students to work at his/her own pace to reinforce reading comprehension.

What is Title I ?

Title I is a federally funded program. The amount each district receives is computed by The U.S.

Department of Education at the county

level. The districts free lunch data is used from the previous school year although, this is not a determining factor for a student to be part of the Title I Program. Students are referred by his/her classroom teacher and receive services based upon his/her individual needs. Students are identified for services using standardized local assessments, MEAP testing, and classroom performance.
